BUILDING LOAN MATCHING CHALLENGE 3RD QUARTER REPORT

Continued Blessing Abound for our 3rd quarter report. As you remember, our Church family was given a challenge to participate in contributing to the building loan fund, which makes extra payments quarterly to reduce our loan. The challenge was for every dollar our Church family contributes, the amount would be matched dollar for dollar by the Challenge Grant Fund. The 1st, 2nd, and 3rd quarter responses have been exceptional. Our 3rd quarter (July, August, September) contributions totaled \$16,660.00, with the matching challenge money, and additional payment was made in the amount of \$33,320.00. A loan balance will be given as soon as this payment is posted. With the 4th quarter contributions, our loan balance will continue to be reduced at an accelerated pace.

Again, thank you for your continued prayers, support and your continued contributions.
